



2020 Early Career Lecture Award

The American Headache Society® (AHS) announces the availability of the 2020 Early Career Lecture Award. This award is for the best paper on headache, head or face pain, or the nature of pain itself written by an 'early career' author. The recipient must be within 10 years of completing their medical residency or terminal research degree (whichever date is later*).

The recipient of this award will receive \$7,500 plus complimentary registration, 4 nights hotel accommodations and travel expenses for the American Headache Society's 62nd Annual Scientific Meeting, being held June 4-7, 2020 in San Diego, CA. The recipient is required to present the paper as a special lecture during the 62nd Annual Scientific Meeting; if the recipient cannot attend, the lecture will not be given.

To be considered for this award, applicants must submit an abstract for consideration at the 62nd Annual Scientific Meeting using the online abstract submission form by **Sunday, February 2, 2020 at 11:59 pm HST.**

In addition, a manuscript should be submitted to the AHS Executive Offices no later than Sunday, March 1, 2020 and should be prepared in accordance with "[Instructions for Authors](#)" as published in the journal *Headache*®. Please note that papers submitted for the Early Career Award should be sent only to the AHS Executive Offices, and not submitted to *Headache* via Manuscript Central. All entries become the property of *Headache* and may be published in the journal at the decision of the Editorial Board. The manuscript will be fast tracked for publication in a 2020 issue of *Headache*.

*Some individuals may have lapses in their training due to a variety of reasons such as medical issues, disability, family care responsibilities, military service, and other reasons. On a case-by-case basis, the American Headache Society Awards Committee will consider extending the definition for 'early career' beyond 10 years since training has been completed.
