The educational mission of the AHS is to improve the knowledge, skills, and professional performance of physicians, psychologists, and advanced practice providers in the care of patients with head, neck, and orofacial pain. The expected result of the overall education program is to realize improvement in professional performance that improves outcomes for patients with head, neck, and orofacial pain. Learner outcomes are measured in terms of Competence (intention to change) using an evaluation following each educational activity, and longer term impact [is measured] using follow up surveys to assess changed Performance (in practice) and/or Patient Outcomes.
